heiSKILLS Seminarzentrum, Bergheimer Str. 58A	Power is not an abstract concept; it is relational, especially in universities. For postdocs, power is as well allocated (contracts, rights, roles), and enacted and negotiated daily: as micropolitics in labs, committees, supervisions, decisions, relationships. Working in presence allows us to do the thing this workshop is about: recognise power in real gestures, in language, in status games and practice responses. This is not a moral workshop about "good vs bad". I plan it as an empowerment workshop: turning power awareness into a tool of professional (self-)leadership.

	 understand the formal power architecture of universities (rules, hierarchies, committees, governance) recognise informal power (network capital, reputational power, symbolic capital – who gets listened to, who gets ignored, who frames the problem) expand their repertoire to use power as constructive agency (design power, not domination) develop strategies to protect themselves and others against power abuse
