Health Insurance

Health insurance for students is compulsory in Germany. Students must be covered by health and nursing care insurance. Student health insurance is generally valid until the student reaches the age of 30. The general contribution for student health insurance and the associated nursing care insurance contribution is set by the Federal Ministry of Health at the same level for all statutory health insurance funds. In the case of health insurance, an individual supplementary contribution rate is added. The monthly contribution for student health insurance in Germany is around €140 - 150 per month (as of summer semester 2025).

Students who bring health insurance from their home country, must have it checked and accepted by a German statutory health insurance company. Please note that very few foreign insurance policies are recognised, as they do not meet the requirements for enrolment.

Health insurance for students in the statutory health insurance fund starts at the beginning of the official semester at the earliest (summer semester = 1 April and winter semester = 1 October). We therefore recommend that you take out additional health insurance, (e.g. travel insurance), should you enter Germany before this date to cover the time until regular health insurance starts.

Newly admitted students must therefore contact a German statutory health insurance provider <u>before enrolment</u> in order to apply for a membership or – if available – have their health insurance from their home country checked. For enrolment, it is mandatory that the statutory health insurance provider initiates an electronic notification to Heidelberg University. (Notification 10 - under the university number H0003588.) Please note that you can contact a statutory health insurance provider already from your home country before you enter Germany. For a list of local statutory health insurance providers in Heidelberg, please refer to the next page.

During enrolment, no health insurance membership certificate needs to be uploaded or submitted, you only need to name your health insurance company.

Below you will find some special features. Please check whether you belong to one of the following groups. If so, the following regulations apply:

EU (European Union) and EEA (European Economic Area) students and students from countries with social security agreements:

Students from countries with which the Federal Republic of Germany has a social security agreement are exempt from compulsory student health insurance. This applies to all countries of the EU, as well as the EEA (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway) and the countries listed below.

The EHIC (European Health Insurance Card) or a corresponding substitute certificate from the statutory health insurance fund in your home country is a sufficient proof. Sufficient proof of entitlement are the certificates BH 6 (Bosnia and Herzegovina), D/RM 111 (Macedonia), DE/MNE 111 (Montenegro), DE 111 SRB (Serbia), A/TN 11 (Tunisia) and A/T 11 (Turkey), GHIC (United Kingdom). The following also applies to you: It is mandatory that the statutory health insurance fund arranges for an electronic notification to be sent to Heidelberg University prior to enrolment. Report 10 - under the university number H0003588. Please contact a German statutory health insurance fund for this purpose.

DAAD scholarship holders:

As a rule, the DAAD has already taken out private health insurance for you. Please submit proof of your private health insurance in Germany to the health insurance company and request that the electronic notification be sent to Heidelberg University.

Students aged 30 and over:

For this group, compulsory insurance in the statutory student health insurance in Germany ends. Please submit proof of your private health insurance in Germany to the health insurance company and request that the electronic notification be sent to Heidelberg University.

Students who are or were already covered by statutory health insurance in Germany

Please contact your statutory health insurance provider and request the health insurance provider to send the electronic notification to Heidelberg University.

Students who have got "family insurance" at one of the statutory health insurance provider in Germany,

Please contact your statutory health insurance provider and request the health insurance provider to send the electronic notification to Heidelberg University.

Students in the Studienkolleg and German language course:

This group is not subject to compulsory student health insurance because they are not enrolled in a subject-related degree programme but in a so-called "pre-subject-related course of study" ("Vorfachstudium"). It is possible and highly recommended to change from a private to a statutory health insurance company when you start your degree programme. There is no obligation to contact the health insurance company with regard to enrolment. However, it is of course possible to seek advice there.

Doctoral students:

Doctoral studies are studies following scientific training and are therefore not subject to compulsory student health insurance according to the legal regulations. However, you have the option of taking out private health insurance in Germany. There is no obligation to contact the health insurance company with regard to enrolment. However, it is of course possible to seek advice there.

Liability Insurance (Haftpflichtversicherung)

A liability insurance (*Haftpflichtversicherung*) is highly recommended. This insurance covers any unintentional damage you may cause (e.g. causing an accident as a bicyclist, etc.). If you already have a similar form of insurance coverage in your home country, it may be valid in Germany as well. For information on coverage in other countries, please contact your provider.
