**Heidelberg University Fee Regulations for the
Master’s Degree Programme in Governance of Risk and Resources**

dated 28 November 2011, amended on 30 September 2020

The Senate of Heidelberg University adopted the following statutes on 29 September 2020 on the basis of § 2 paragraph 2 and § 13 paragraph 1 of the State Higher Education Fees Act of Baden-Württemberg (Landeshochschulgebührengesetz, LHGebG) dated 1 January 2005 (official state gazette, p. 1), last amended by Article 3 of the Act on 15 October 2019 (official state gazette, p. 405, 411).

Approved by the Rector on 30 September 2020.

§ 1 Applicability

Heidelberg University charges tuition fees for the Master’s degree programme in Governance of Risk and Resources. In accordance with § 12 of the State Higher Education Fees Act of Baden-Württemberg (LHGebG), the administrative fee, as well as fees related to the Student Services Act (Studentenwerkgesetz) remain unaffected.

§ 2 Tuition Fee Amount

The tuition fees are EUR 2,500 per semester.

§ 3 Obligation to Pay

Anyone who applies for enrolment, or who is already enrolled in the Master’s degree programme is obliged to pay the tuition fees.

§ 4 Due Date for Payment

The fee becomes payable on the date of application for enrolment or on the date of re-registration. Further information can be found in the notification of fees.

§ 5 Waiver

If request for payment is deemed unreasonable in individual cases, the tuition fee may be completely or partially waived. Note that students must submit an application for a waiver of fees. In consultation with the admission committee, the faculty board will decide whether a waiver of fees can be granted.

§ 6 Coming into Force

These regulations become effective on the day after they are published in the Rector's bulletin (Mitteilungsblatt des Rektors).
