Founded in 1386, Heidelberg University is the oldest university in present-day Germany, with one of the best research performances in Europe. Its success in the German Excellence Initiative and Excellence Strategy and in international rankings testify to its leading role in the scientific landscape. In educating its more than 30,000 students and promoting outstanding young researchers, Heidelberg University focuses on research-based teaching and excellent conditions for individualized and interdisciplinary studies. In addition to its proven excellence in research and teaching, the university is characterized by its international profile and networks. Heidelberg University also draws its research strength from close cooperation with numerous local non-university research institutions and industry partners.

OUTSTANDING SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS

With a large number of advisory and supervisory opportunities, as well as specific professional development programs, Heidelberg University accompanies students at all stages of their career development. Students from at home and abroad can turn to the Central Student Advisory Office, which answers individual questions about their studies at Heidelberg University. In addition, the university assists students in planning periods of study abroad or placements in the framework of their course. In the doctoral phase, the Graduate Academy is the coordination center for all interdisciplinary continuing education and further training opportunities. The broad range of programs offered by the Career Service contributes especially to a successful start in working life.

RESEARCH-BASED AND INTERDISCIPLINARY

As an advanced course of studies, a master's program usually follows a bachelor's or other undergraduate program. With a range of more than 100 master's programs at 13 faculties, Heidelberg University offers a variety of subjects that is virtually unparalleled in Germany. Some master's programs are taught partially or completely in English. A master's degree is a solid foundation for entry into professional life or a career in academia.

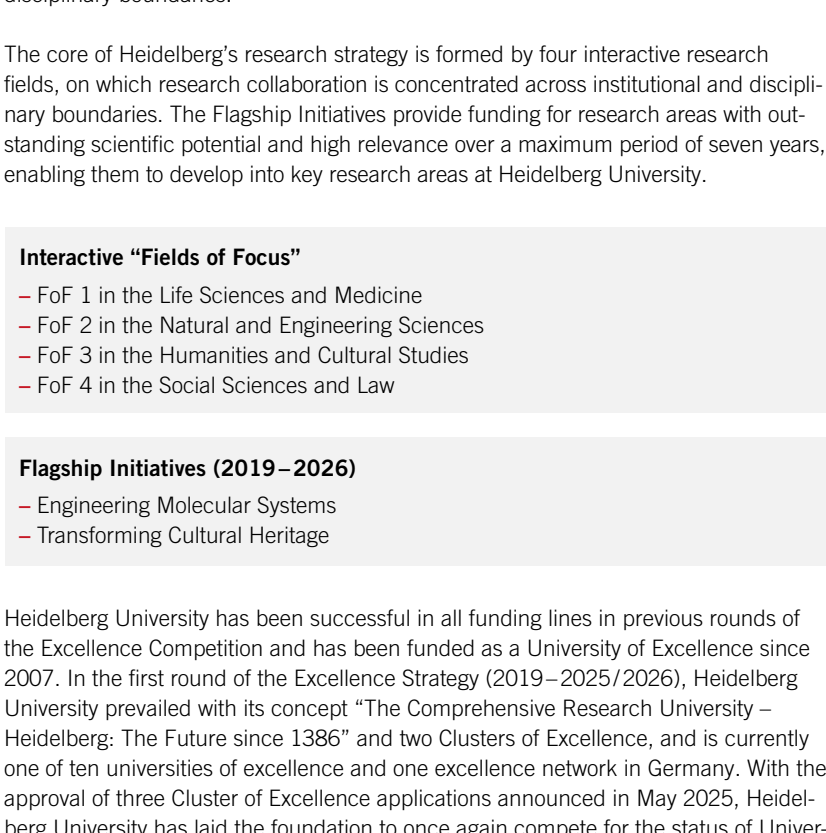

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

A master's program is usually completed in four semesters – in some cases two or three semesters – and awards graduates the academic degree of Master of Science (M.Sc.), Master of Arts (M.A.) or Master of Education (M.Ed.). A four-semester master's program usually requires 120 credit points, of which 30 are awarded for the master's thesis.

Molecular life sciences at the Faculty of Biosciences, applied mathematics and scientific computing at the Faculty of Mathematics and Computer Science, and physical chemistry at the Faculty of Chemistry and Earth Sciences are among the internationally visible areas in research and teaching. The Faculty of Physics and Astronomy conducts research in three main areas: fundamental particles and their interactions, astrophysics and cosmology, and complex quantum systems. The newly established Heidelberg Faculty of Engineering Sciences covers molecular biotechnology, the engineering of molecular systems, computer engineering and medical technology.

EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH

Academic dialogue across disciplinary boundaries

As a research university with an international presence, Heidelberg University considers the extensive theoretical and methodological expertise of its subjects and subject cultures to be an essential characteristic of its scientific work. At the same time, it recognizes its unique potential to investigate important issues affecting the future of humankind, and thus take on social responsibility, by encouraging cooperation across disciplinary boundaries.

The core of Heidelberg's research strategy is formed by four interactive research fields, on which research collaboration is concentrated across institutional and disciplinary boundaries. The Flagship Initiatives provide funding for research areas with outstanding scientific potential and high relevance over a maximum period of seven years, enabling them to develop into key research areas at Heidelberg University.

Heidelberg University has been successful in all funding lines in previous rounds of the Excellence Competition and has been funded as a University of Excellence since 2007. In the first round of the Excellence Strategy (2019–2025/2026), Heidelberg University prevailed with its concept "The Comprehensive Research University – Heidelberg: The Future since 1386" and two Clusters of Excellence, and is currently one of ten universities of excellence and one excellence network in Germany. With the approval of three Cluster of Excellence applications announced in May 2025, Heidelberg University has laid the foundation to once again compete for the status of University of Excellence in the Excellence Strategy II (2026/2027–2032/2033). In March 2026, it was again awarded the title of University of Excellence, based on its self-assessment report entitled "SEMPER APERTUS – Heidelberg: The Comprehensive Research University". Funding will begin on 1 January 2027.

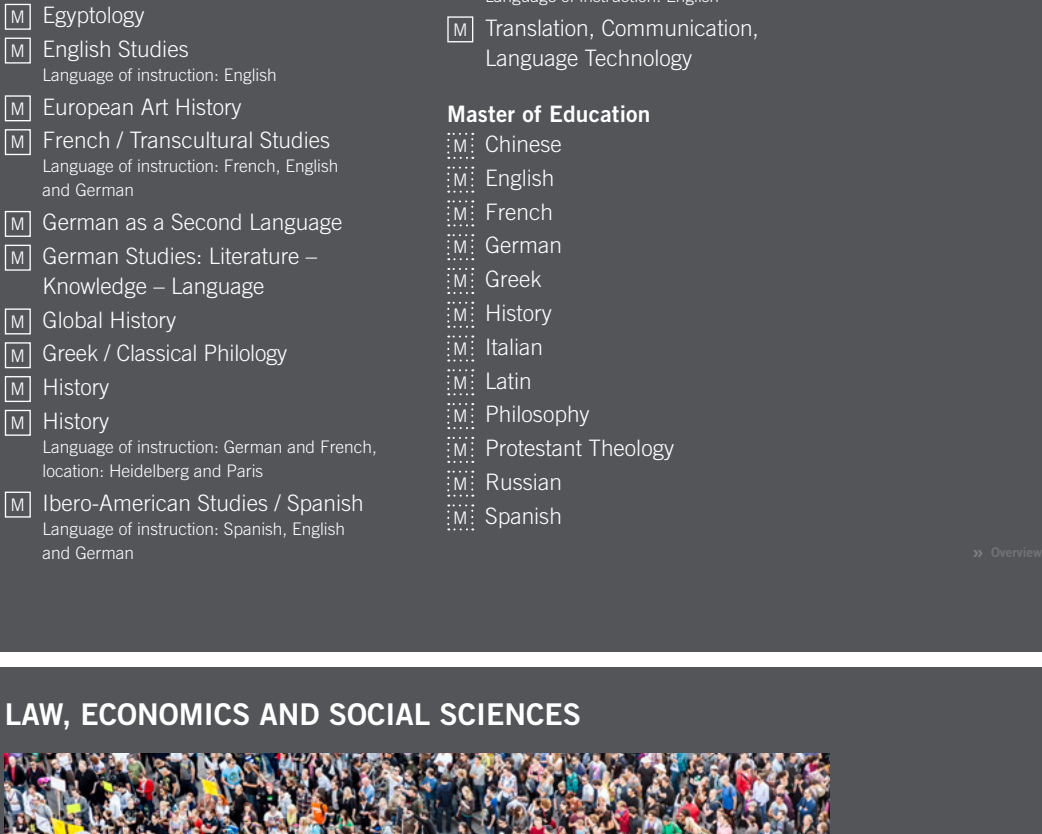

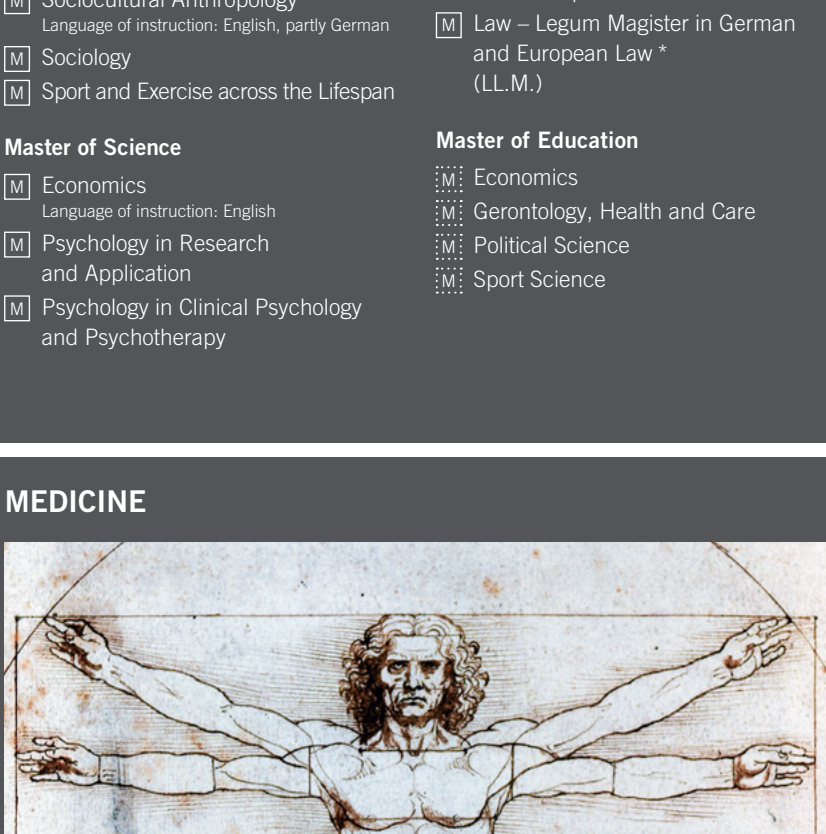
