Visa or Residence Permit

No visa / residence permit required, just a valid passport or ID card:

EU students: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden. **Students from EEA countries**: Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway.

All international students from outside the EU and the EEA generally <u>need a visa or a residence</u> permit with supplementary sheet in order to study at Heidelberg University.

Students with a refugee background / students in the possession of one the following permits – §23, §24, §25 or §60a AufenthG or §55 AsylVfG – are strongly recommend to contact Student Advisory Service of the university's International Relations Office / Ms. Herting before enrolling: Tel.: 06221 54 12722; email: maria.herting@zuv.uni-heidelberg.de

When do you have to apply for a visa and/or a residence permit?

- a) Students from Andorra, Australia, Brazil, Canada, El Salvador, Honduras, Israel, Japan, Monaco, New Zealand, San Marino, South Korea, Switzerland United Kingdom and the United States may enter Germany without a visa, but you have to apply for a residence permit at the local Foreigners' Registration Office (Ausländerbehörde) within three months.
- b) Students from all other countries must obtain a visa (for study purposes) before departing for Germany. The application for a visa for study purposes must be made at the German Embassy/Consulate in the student's home country. After arrival, students have to apply for an extension of their stay in form of a residence permit at the Foreigners' Registration Office.

Entry into Germany is only permitted, if you have a valid residence status. You do not have to present your visal residence status when enrolling. However, after you enrolment you should clarify your legal situation with the local Foreigners Registration office by handing in a certificate of enrolment.

The following visas **cannot be extended or changed into a study visa** by the local Foreigners' registration office in Germany: **Tourist visa, visa according to the Schengen Agreement, business visa**. This means students must return to their home country and apply for another visa.

Important! First, you must <u>report your address</u> to the registration office/citizen centre (*Einwohnermeldeamt/Bürgeramt*) in your city of residence. <u>Only after this is it possible to apply for an extension of your visa.</u>

Please note: If you have not found a permanent room at the time of application of your residence permit, please refer to that Foreigners' Registration Office (*Ausländerbehörde*) in charge of the area where your current accommodation lies.

Where can you apply for the residence permit?

Issues pertaining the entrance and residency in Germany are handled by the Foreigners' Registration Office (*Ausländerbehörde*). Your current address at the time of your residence registration will determine which office you have to contact. Please contact your foreigners authority (list below) 6 weeks before your visa / residence title expires.

<u>Please note:</u> There are two Foreigners' Registration offices in Heidelberg. One is responsible for the citizens living in the city / municipality of Heidelberg, the other one for citizens living in the municipalities of the Rhein-Neckar-Kreis.

Which documents do you need to prepare?

When you apply for a residence/study permit or extension, you must bring the following documents:

- o Application form for a residence permit
- Letter of Admission from Heidelberg University or an enrolment certificate, stating the subject(s) and intended degree and current number of semester
- o Current health insurance certificate
- 1 biometric passport photo
- o Passport with visa / entry stamp
- o Proof of funding of €934 per month (or €1,081 from the age of 30), e.g. officially certified financial statement, proof of scholarship, other (state funding from home country, blocked account).
- o Residence registration

In certain cases, the Foreigners' Registration Office will ask for additional documents. You will be informed about it at the time of application.

Fee: €100 for a new residence permit, €93 extension of a residence permit
